Graduation Ceremony



The Graduation ceremony was held on 27-02-2016. It was truly a momentous occasion for our College as there were 600 graduates who received their degree in person in the presence of their parents, Secretary Shri.K.Ragunathan, Principal Dr. K. Anbarasu, Committee members, Senate members, the member of the Management, members of teaching and non teaching staff and the Chief Guest **A.P. Dash Vice Chancellor Central University of Tamil Nadu, Tiruvarur** (a total of 2000 participants).

The graduates and their parents were notably impressed by

the splendor of the ceremonial function and the grandeur of the auditorium in which the ceremony took place. Many were obviously "bursting with pride", as they were congratulated on their academic achievements by the chief guest.

The day's events, starting from the Procession from the Secretary's office to the Auditorium, marked an extraordinary beginning for all concerned. The Secretary Shri. K. Ragunathan declared the graduation ceremony open and the Principal Dr. K. Anbarasu welcomed the gathering and presented the college report. The Chief Guest **A.P. Dash, Vice Chancellor, Central University of Tamil Nadu** warmly congratulated the graduates on their achievements and delivered the convocation address.

The Chief Guest acknowledged that the journey of the graduates in getting to this point was an arduous one. He stated that it had been far from easy for the graduates and that it represented a long and sustained commitment. The Chief Guest continued: "It is said that education is the fulcrum of life, for peace, progress and development. It provides the seedlings for culture and civilization. It is a passport to freedom and liberty and a higher calling in life".

Speaking more generally about the occasion, he said, the occasion called for a moment to pause and also to think about the entire enterprise of education. This calls for a serious thought at this point of time because for some of the graduates, the occasion would probably mark the end of the formal academic programme. He also spoke about how a host of initiatives from the Government of India, especially in the recent years have been geared to address the issue of employability and skill development. In this regard, the Global Initiative of Academic Networks (GIAN), among others, under the auspices of the MHRD, assumes singular significance with its global sweep. Besides, a series of steps for accreditation and ranking systems aim at transforming the Indian educational scenario and to set it firmly on a relentless pursuit of excellence.

With regard to the long term sustainability and optimal life, he said that its motto will be education for the liberation of all. And liberation obviously implies that the oppressive structures of sorts will have to disappear for all the stakeholders and definitely not just for humanity alone. He concluded, "I would like to remind the young graduates that, you are among the few fortunate persons who have had access to educational experience at this renowned institution. This experience will surely be the beacon light for you throughout your life".

Following the address of the Chief Guest, the ceremony continued with the main event of the conferring of degrees to the graduates. The Heads of Department of the various courses presented the names of the candidates and the candidates received their degrees from the Chief Guest. This was followed by the pledge led by the Principal and taken by the students. The Graduation ceremony came to a close with the singing of the National Anthem.

The recent incidents at Indian Universities, the news of honour killings, all these point towards a culture of intolerance and insensitivity leading to a let-down in the social and moral fabric of our society. In this context, Mr. S. Gopinath said : "I believe caste, religion and politics should be kept out of educational institutions. Schools and colleges are holy places where the students are enlightened by the power of knowledge and wisdom."

Speaking to the students about the important aspects of life, Mr. Gopinath elaborated on ethics and values which define human morality, in terms of concepts such as good and bad, right and wrong, virtue and vice, justice and crime. Just because one has an intellectual understanding of ethics and values it does not mean that he/she will do the right thing, or make the right choices. It requires a concerted effort to bring congruence between what one believes and what one does. The most important regulator with respect to ethics and values is our conscience. If we do an act and if it does not prick our conscience, then invariably it will be correct morally. However, how the conscience develops in a person depends on his upbringing and environment.

According to Mr. S. Gopinath, Ethics is a tricky subject. In this highly competitive world, we might be tempted to sacrifice our ethics and values for personal gains. A person who is able to stick on to his/her ethics and values would always be successful in the long run. He wished all the students a bright and successful future and hoped that each one of them would practice high levels of ethics and values in their life.

He concluded his speech with a poem of Rabindranath Tagore entitled "Where the mind is without fear". He wanted the students to strive to create a society as envisioned by Tagore in this poem where there are no divisive forces, where education is

used as an effective means to create a more enlightened and forward-looking society and where values and ethics are up-held. The address by the Chief Guest was followed by the Prize and Award Distribution Ceremony. **Various scholarships, best outgoing student awards and academic proficiency prizes instituted by various philanthropists, and individuals were awarded to the recipients on the occasion.** Meritorious students were given prizes and certificates for their contribution. Dr.R.Sundararaman, Controller of Examination, proposed a vote of thanks. The function was followed by lunch for all the guests, students, faculty and alumni.

Rajaji Memorial Endowment Lecture

The Rajaji Memorial Endowment Lecture was held on 27-01-2016. The Former **CBI Director Dr. R.K. Raghavan** has expressed concern over the "alarming drop in integrity levels" among civil service officers. Delivering the Rajaji Memorial Endowment Lecture on **Maintaining Integrity in Public Services** in our College, he said recent happenings at high places in the senior civil services were a

matter of concern. Sardar Vallabhai Patel, who was the first Home Minister of the country, pioneered the creation of the Indian Administrative Service and Indian Police Service as



successors to the Indian Civil Service and imperial Police after Independence. He said these two services would lend stability to the nation, as they provided a honest administration to the common citizen. The first objective had been reasonably fulfilled. The second objective remained a dream.

While a majority of the IAS officers had been a model of probity, the same thing could not be said of the rest, who, though in a minority, accounted for a significant number, he said.

Shri. R.K. Raghavan said there was this common perception that enormous political corruption was a cause for civil service corruption. It was only partially true. It was undeniable that some IAS and central officers had been pliable and willing accomplices to corruption in high places. This had to change swiftly. Only then the country could hold its head high in the comity of nations.

While terming the corruption at the high level was "equally disturbing", he said the office of the Tashildar and the Police station were two fundamental units of administration. If these were transparent centres, where all services were provided without expectations of illegal gratification, the country would win half the battle. "We are still looked upon as a nation where corruption starts from birth and lasts until one reaches the grave. The charge is that one has to grease somebody's palm even to obtain a birth certificate".

Paying rich tributes to Rajaji, he said he was unique in many ways. He never chased offices. He was a man for the crisis, and hence, public office chased him. He steered the administration in most difficult times. There was so much for the current generation to learn from his life .

Smt. T. Sengamalam Iyengar Endowment Lecture

The Department of Sanskrit conducted Smt. T. Sengamalam Iyengar Endowment Lecture on 3rd March 2016. The Endowment is instituted by Sri T. Padmanabhan, the illustrious son of the former Principal of the college Sri T. Thothadri Iyengar, in the name of his mother

Smt. T. Sengamalam Iyengar. Sri Thothadri Iyengar joined the college as an Assistant Lecturer in History and later become the Head of the Department of Economics in the year 1926. He became the Principal in the year 1952 and retired in the year 1955.

Dr. Thiruppur Krishnan, Editor of **Amudhasurabi**, the Tamil Monthly, delivered a lecture on **Sanskrit the Elixir for Virtuous Living**. He took the



examples of two great Sanskrit Poets, Kalidasa and Adisankara. Kalidasa is the model for simple and sweet poetry. Kalidasa composed two great court epics and three dramas. "Abhijnanasakuntalam" is considered as the best specimen of Sanskrit drama. Adisankara, on the other hand, insisted on non-dualism.

There had been exchange of thoughts among the poets of Tamil and Sanskrit, without any bias. We find parallel thoughts in both these classical languages of India. India has continued to remain united, in spite of differences in clothing, practices and faiths. But the undercurrent of culture, Samskriti, has remained the same. Noble thoughts have influenced the people, irrespective of the language. The holy chants from the sacred texts have kept the people virtuous, he added.

Earlier, the Principal, **Dr. K. Anbarasu**, presided over the function. He recollected the services rendered by Swami Vivekananda, Mahatma Gandhi and other National Leaders in uniting the Indians on the basis of single culture. Both Sanskrit and Tamil are the Classical Languages of India, a rare combination. Nowhere in the world, have two languages remained the Classical Languages in a single country, he said.

Dr. V.R. Mathiazhagan, Professor in Charge of the Unaided Courses introduced Dr. Thiruppur Krishnan to the audience. He quoted from the writings of the day's speaker and identified the uniform ideas for virtuous living. He said that Dr. Thiruppur Krishnan practices what he preaches.

Dr.R.Sundhararaman, Controller of Examination, in his felicitation, recollected the efforts of the founders of the College. Earlier, **Dr. V.M. Ananthanarayanan**, the Associate Professor and Head of the Department of Sanskrit welcomed the gathering. **Dr. D. Prasanna Balaji**, Director and Head of the Department of Physical Education proposed a vote of thanks.

The Physics Golden Jubilee Endowment Lecture

The sixth Golden Jubilee Endowment Lecture (Series VI) of the physics department was held on 10.03.2016. Dr.R.Jagannathan, **Former Vice-Chancellor, Mid- East University, Ras A1-Khaimah, UAE**, delivered the lecture on **Gravitational Waves and our Wonderful Universe**. In his lecture, he noted the importance of gravitational waves in the evolution of earthly planets. He explained the observation of gravitational waves and how they might affect our universe. He pitched for students taking up astronomical research. He was candid in saying that the research work with respect to gravitational waves were quiet early and asked the students to still learn about these waves. In his lecture he covered topics like black holes, evolution of earth and big bang theory. He also explained the importance of various theories on evolution of universe. He correlated these with gravitational waves.



Earlier Dr. K.Anbarasu, Principal, in his presidential address encouraged the students to take up research in their career. He also highlighted the importance of higher education for the society.

Dr. S. Pari, Head, Department of Physics, welcomed the gathering. Dr. R. Ramasamy Assistant Professor of Physics, proposed a vote of thanks.

Prof. S. Thothadri Iyengar Memorial Endowment Lecture

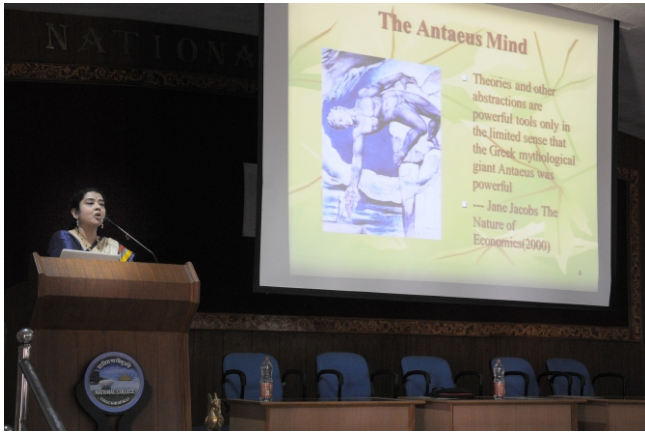
Prof. S. Thothadri Iyengar Endowment Lecture was held on 11.03.2016. **Swami Murugananda Saraswathi, Managing Trustee, Arunachala Unique Mountain Trust** delivered the lecture on the topic **Chicago Address: an Impact**. In his speech Swamiji highlighted how the Chicago address left a remarkable impact in the minds of the people globally. Swami Vivekananda in his Chicago address had crossed all the barriers regarding race, colour, creed and language. The opening words of the address "Sisters and brothers of America" produced a scintillating effect in the conference and Created a good impression on the secular India. The Chief Guest apart from explaining the philosophical and social angles of the Chicago address also commented on Swami Vivekananda's language skills in putting across the ideas. He also stressed the point



that language is an effective tool to express the even complex ideas in simple words. Dr. K. Anbarasu, Principal presided over the function. Dr. K. Srinivasan, Associate Professor, Department of English, proposed a vote of thanks.

Principal Saranathan Memorial Endowment Lecture

Dr. Swarnalatha Rangarajan, Professor of English, Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, Indian Institute of Technology, Madras delivered the fifth lecture in the series on the topic **The Ecological Literary Imperative** on the 14th of March 2016, at our College. Speaking on the connection between



literature and environment, she said, the writers of the present century cannot remain inured to the developments in the world around them. Both the creative and the critical writing on environment must be worthy of the deeper commitments as the thinking itself has changed from mechanistic to system thinking. And the art of story-telling is seen today not as a hyper intellectual game. She said, "The conventional self focuses on identity and agency and the instincts are oriented towards self-preservation; whereas the ecological self recognizes its position in nature and concentrates on survival and sustainment of all life forms." She quoted the Buddhist monk Thich Nhat Hanh who famously remarked, "If everything is interrelated, nothing has its own self-contained existence." She talked of human beings evolving into interbeings, that is, people being citizens of both the world of culture and of nature.

The world which we live in is a victim of slow poisoning and slow violence, but such a world should not be the inheritance of future generations. Explaining the Greek word "oikos" which means one's home, she said, we have to extend the idea to the moribund planet and regard it as our home. When this abstraction gives way to understanding, humanity can realize its difference and specificity. Finally, she pointed out the free narrative spaces that are available before us and even a simple dictum like "Listen to the birds sing" is loaded with meaning and expressive of moral imperative. The idea of eco-cosmopolitanism that is sweeping the world makes us conscious of our reality, that is, biodiversity. It also reminds us of our responsibility towards our own biome and biota. She quoted many haiku poems and introduced the audience to many seminal texts that have laid the foundation for ecocritical thinking.

Dr.C.Rangarajan Endowment Lecture

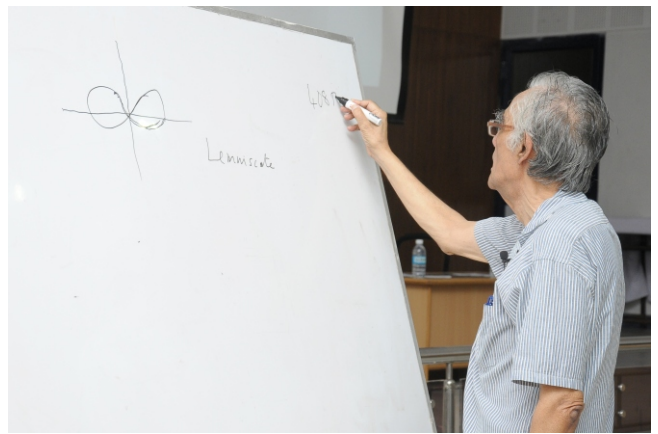

Srinivasan, FCA, a leading Senior Auditor** who has been practicing for more than 50 years, delivered an inspiring talk on the topic **Budget -2016**.



The Highlights of the speech:-

(a) Slab rates of income-tax are not changed. It is same as it was in the financial year 2015-16.

(b) Education Cess & SHEC : same as it was in the financial year 2015-16.

(c) Rebate under Sec 87A : With the objective of providing relief to resident individuals in the lower income slab i.e. total income not exceeding Rs. 5,00,000, section 87A is proposed to be amended so as to increase the maximum amount of rebate available from existing limit of Rs.2,000 to Rs.5,000.

(d) Maximum limit of deduction under section 80GG increased:- The maximum limit of deduction under section 80GG, in respect of rent paid by individuals who do not get any house rent allowance from the employer and who do not own any house, proposed to be increased from Rs. 2,000 p.m to Rs. 5,000 p.m.

(e) Presumptive taxation:- Increase in threshold limit for persons other than companies /LLP having income from business opting presumptive taxation under Section 44AD In order to reduce the compliance burden of the small tax payers and facilitate the ease of doing business, the threshold limit for availing the benefit of presumptive taxation scheme proposed to be increased from Rs. 1 crore to Rs. 2 crore, in respect of eligible businesses. The threshold limit proposed to be increased to bring relief to a large number of assesses in the Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME)

(f) Presumptive taxation scheme extended to professionals: In order to rationalize the presumptive

taxation scheme and to reduce the compliance burden of the small tax payers having income from profession and to facilitate the ease of doing business, the presumptive taxation regime proposed to be extended to professionals having gross receipts not exceeding Rs. 50 lakhs in the previous year at a sum equal to 50% of such gross receipts.

(g) Threshold limit increased for tax audit for persons having professional Income:-

The threshold limit for tax audit under section 44AB, for getting accounts audited proposed to be increased from Rs. 25 lakhs to Rs. 50 lakhs, in case of persons carrying on profession.

(h) Additional deduction of interest to "first home buyers": In furtherance of the goal of the Government of providing 'housing for all, it is proposed to incentivize first-home buyers availing home loans, by providing additional deduction of Rs. 50,000 in respect of interest on loan taken for residential house property from any financial institution.

This incentive is proposed to be available to a house property of a value less than Rs. 50 lakhs in respect of which a loan of an amount not exceeding Rs. 35 lakhs has been sanctioned during the Financial Year 2016-17. Further, this benefit proposed to be extended till the repayment of loan continues.

(i) Gross Dividend would be taxable in the hands of recipients: The income by way of gross dividend, to be chargeable to tax in the case of an individual, Hindu undivided family (HUF) or a firm, who is resident in India @ 10%, if the same is in excess of Rs. 10 lakh

(j) Rate of surcharge increased from 12% to 15%: The surcharge rate to be raised from 12% to 15% on persons, other than companies, firms and cooperative societies having income above Rs. 1 crore.

(k) Tax Collection at Sources:- Scope of TCS expanded to include sale of luxury cars and other goods and services: In order to reduce the quantum of cash transaction in sale of any goods and services and for curbing the flow of unaccounted money in the trading system and to bring high value transactions within the tax net, it is proposed to provide that the seller shall collect the tax @1% from the purchaser on sale of motor vehicle of the value exceeding Rs. 10 lakhs and sale in cash of any goods (other than bullion and jewellery), or providing of any services (other than payments on which tax is deducted at source under Chapter XVI I-B) exceeding Rs. 2 lakhs.

Penalty leviable for concealment of income rationalized: The entire scheme of penalty proposed to be modified by providing different categories of misdemeanor with graded penalty and thereby substantially reducing the discretionary power of the tax officers. The penalty rates will now be 50% of tax in case of underreporting of income and 200% of tax where there is misreporting of facts. Tax on black money declared would be 30 per cent plus 7.5 per cent penalty and 7.5 per cent surcharge Mr. B. Sudharshan of III B.com proposed a vote of thanks.

Economics Association

Economics Association Meeting was held on 16.02.2016. Principal Dr. K. Anbarasu presided over the meeting. Dr.D.Srinivasan HOD of Economics welcomed the gathering. **Dr.D.Kumar, Associate Professor in Economics, JMC, Trichy** delivered a special lecture on **Urban Economic Issues**. In his speech he remarked that



providing of infrastructure to urban areas was the direct impact of urbanization. Mr. J. Tamilarasan II M.A Economics proposed a vote of thanks.

The valedictory function of Economics Association was held on 07.03.2016. Principal K.Anbarasu presided over the meeting. Dr.D.Srinivasan HOD of Economics welcomed the gathering. **Sri.R.Narayanan, Chief Manager, Indian Bank, Srirangam** delivered the Valedictory address on **Banking Scenario Financial Inclusion**. He pointed out that the need to have Financial Inclusion arises on account of



a large section of Indian population remaining unbanked even after 65 years of Independence. This malaise has led to generation of Financial instability and pauperism among the lower income groups who do not have access to financial products and services. However, in recent year both the Government and RBI have been pushing the concept and idea of financial inclusion. Financial inclusion is the delivery of financial services at affordable costs to vast sections of the disadvantaged and low income groups. This assures upliftment to disadvantaged groups. Mr.E.Thangapandian, II MA Economics, proposed a vote of thanks.

The English Literary Association

The English Literary Association held a special meeting on 17.12.2015. **Dr. S. Senthilnathan, Assistant Professor, Department of Educational Technology, Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirappalli**, was invited to give a guest lecture on the topic **Technology Enhanced Language Learning**. Speaking on the occasion, quoting Marc Prensky, he said, "Most of us have become digital natives and digital immigrants." He added that students and scholars across the globe relied nowadays heavily on non-print learning resources to enhance their knowledge. Describing the present generation as net generation and electronic communicators, he observed that their learning required digital age pedagogy. He pointed out the thriving Online Learning Communities (OLC) and the shifting learning environments. He told the students, "We shape our technology first and then the technology shapes us. We can't underestimate the human experience in wi-fi hotspots. Learning has become interactive, participatory, engaging and



involving. One should do today's job with today's tools. Computers, mobile phones and touch boards in smart classrooms are the new educational tools. We have even perfected the digital lingo. Applying the available digital age technology has made the learning process dynamic and the visual generation has a definite edge over the verbal generation which found the learning process static with the emphasis only on reading and writing. The new generation of learners is techno savvy and very comfortable with multitasking and living in parallel worlds. Technology has made learning visual, auditory and kinaesthetic. The information flow is also at a faster pace and the notion of 'flipped classroom' has come to stay." At the end of the lecture, Dr. S. Senthilnathan took the students on a virtual tour and introduced them to **"Must Visit Web Portals for the ELT Professionals of the Digital Age"** and **"Web 2.0 Technologies for Teaching, Learning and Testing"**. The lecture meet was presided over by Dr. S. Ramnath, Principal-in-Charge. He paid rich compliments to the department for arranging such lectures of relevance and great usefulness to the learners. Her job was to train such students within a time frame and the pressure was to teach contemporary English. She said, "English today has a global reach because of the communication facilities and the internet.

It is also the most preferred language of translation. News on all subjects from all nations finds ready translation into English. And those who seek information about various nations, cultures or simply about events or happenings have to turn to English for understanding and reporting. Students from China show a greater degree of interest in English language in recent times as they prefer Western higher education.

Moreover, English has proved itself to be the source language for augmenting one's knowledge. So there is pressure on students to master the language in order to understand books written in English and other knowledge resources available in English. Unlike in India, where English is taught as second language, in China it is regarded as foreign languages.

In China, English has only been a language of trade for too long." Earlier, E. Nandhini of I M.A. (English) welcomed the gathering and introduced the speaker to the audience. Dr. R.Elavarasu, the Head of the Department of English, in his presidential address made a reference to the measures taken by the department of English to improve the standard of English of the students mostly drawn from villages and poor families. Later she spoke on the difference between on exile and diaspora. We could also draw a distinction between exile and diaspora to further define what diaspora literature is. The difference between exile and diaspora may lie in a book's attitude toward the homeland and toward the migration. Exile emphasizes the forced nature of the migration and the freshness of the experience of leaving the homeland; exile is not neutral and exiled peoples usually possess a single-minded desire to return to their homeland. Time is also a factor: the first exilic literature may have been written during the Babylonian exile of the sixth century B.C.E., when the experience and memory of it was still vivid. She concluded with references to diasporic writers and their work on diaspora. Dr. V.R. Mathiazhagan, Professor In Charge of unaided program of our college presided over the function and Dr. R. Elavarasu, Head, Department of English and Dr. T.G. Akila Head, Department of English, Unaided Program, felicitated and honored the chief guest. He wanted the students to improve their mathematical, analytical, and reasoning skills. Dr. V.R. She also explained the platforms and tools, databases, business Intelligence tools, Mining tools and File system programming language. Big data platform Hadoop runs java coding. So gain knowledge in the programming languages like c, c++ and java”.

She also explained the Applications of Big Data in Smarter Healthcare, Air Traffic Control, Manufacturing, Telecom, Trading Analytics, Search Quality and so on. We can access our home appliances through our iPhone apps. So our life is blended with technology.

She used the quote, “Your Attitude decides your Altitude”. and concluded, “Be confident and face the future”. Students were keenly listening to her talk. They gave a big applause after she completed her lecture.
